

## Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III Report – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

July 1, 2021

**Gurnick Academy of Medical Arts, LLC (OPE ID: 04169800)** received education stabilization funds under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) (P.L. 117-2). This Fund Report applies to the student portion received under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund that is designated exclusively for emergency financial aid grants to students.

The institution appreciates that Congress and the President have made these critical funds available for eligible students who have expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus pandemic. We take receipt of these federal funds seriously and are distributing them in accordance with ARP and implementing guidance.

1. The institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used, or intends to use the funds received under section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP program to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP program is **\$1,044,424.00**.
3. The total amount of emergency financial aid grants distributed to students under section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP program from **January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021** is **\$0**.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, and thus eligible to receive emergency financial aid grants under section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP program, as of the date of this Fund Report is **TBD**.<sup>2</sup>
5. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant under section 2003(a)(4) of the ARP program from **January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021** is **0**.

<sup>2</sup> For the purposes of this report, institutions may determine the number of eligible students based on the number of students for whom the institution has received an Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) plus the number of students who completed an alternative application form developed by the institution for this purpose. The institution may then apply this number to its own methodological framework for disbursement of funds to produce a final total of eligible students at the institution. The institution is not asked to make assumptions about the potential eligibility of students for whom the institution has not received an ISIR or an alternative application.
